Peabody College of Vanderbilt University seeks a dynamic researcher and scholar for the Dunn Family Chair in Psychoeducational Assessment. The Dunn Chair will lead a research program focused on assessment and testing issues that may include strengthening traditional assessments or developing new assessments for children and youth—with and without disabilities—who are at risk for school failure.

Specific qualifications for the position: (1) an important program of research on assessment with children and youth; (2) demonstrated interest in linking assessment to academic, vocational, and social interventions in learning or work settings; (3) a background in individual differences, measurement, and statistics; (4) a strong record of publications, external funding, and mentoring at the graduate level; and (5) eligibility for appointment at the rank of full professor in special education, with secondary appointments in other Vanderbilt departments as appropriate.

Peabody College, ranked first for the last 3 years among schools of education nationwide, provides strong faculty support (e.g., competitive salaries, generous start-up funds, secretarial help, and post-grant award management), as does the transdisciplinary Vanderbilt Kennedy Center for Research on Human Development (<http://kc.vanderbilt.edu>) located on the Peabody College campus. The Department of Special Education, also ranked first among special education departments and programs in the country, includes faculty committed to excellence in research and teaching.
