The Department of Psychology invites applications for a full-time tenure-stream appointment in 'Quantitative Methodology for Psychological Research' at the Assistant Professor level to commence July 1, 2012.

The successful candidate will have a PhD in Psychology, specializing in quantitative methods. Applicants should have an ongoing program of research and specialize in one or more of the following areas: multilevel/hierarchical modeling, methods for brain imaging data, structural equation modeling, measurement (e.g., item response theory), non-parametric or robust methods, or methods for longitudinal data. In addition to joining the existing quantitative faculty in the department's recently formed 'Quantitative Methods' area, the successful candidate will also have opportunities to collaborate with researchers in one or more of the department's six other areas, namely 'Brain, Behaviour and Cognitive Science', 'Clinical', 'Clinical-Developmental', 'Developmental and Cognitive Processes', 'History and Theory', and 'Social-Personality'. Candidates should show excellence or promise of excellence in teaching and in scholarly research and publication. The successful candidate must be suitable for prompt appointment to the Faculty of Graduate Studies.
