

The University Of Oklahoma Department Of Psychology announces a tenure track Assistant Professor level opening in the area of Quantitative Psychology. We invite applicants from any area of Quantitative Methods. The minimum qualification for the position is a doctoral degree in quantitative methods in Psychology or a highly related discipline within Psychology. (Ph.D. must be completed by hire date.) Excellent applicants must have an active and successful research program in applied statistics, psychometric methods, and/or measurement. We particularly invite applicants with research expertise in the development and evaluation of modern modeling methods, such as Structural Equation Modeling, Mixture Modeling, or Bayesian Modeling. In accordance with our teaching mission, the ideal candidate is expected to be capable of teaching large sections of undergraduate applied statistics as well as small graduate-level seminars in advanced statistics. In addition, we will evaluate candidates on their potential to conduct and collaborate on substantive research in one or more areas outside of Quantitative Psychology.

The Quantitative Psychology program at the University of Oklahoma recently celebrated its 40th anniversary. In a department of approximately 22 faculty members, four positions are devoted to Quantitative Psychology, with 6 affiliated faculty members in Mathematical Modeling, Decision Theory, and Industrial/Organizational psychology. The Quantitative Program serves all of OU, as we offer coursework and consulting services to faculty and students throughout the university. In addition to research excellence, we have a longstanding commitment to teaching quality, and excellent applicants will have a strong teaching orientation as well as an active research program.

Review of applications will begin on November 15, 2011, and will continue until a candidate is hired.
